Thirty years from its creation, I.S.V.A.V., nowadays, enjoys a consolidated success of public and visibility despite the difficulties due to the general economic crisis and of the artistic glass sector in particular.

In order to ensure that future activities are accomplished, two main lines of actions will have to be closely addressed. First of all, those stated in the Statute, i.e. the historical and scientific study of glass and its art, with special attention to the tradition of Altare, the promotion of local glass production and the relevant

education for young people, the promotion of MAV and of the Library Specialised in Glass. Secondly, the ability to harmonise a local dimension with an international one. tradition with innovation in view of the promotion of the history and techniques of the Ars Vitrea of Altare. Such ability must also bring together the promotion of new technical, cultural and artistic experiences through the interactions with glass experts from other schools, artists, designers and historians of national and international reputation. With the ambition of providing

room for debate and becoming a reference point while facilitating the exchange of the experiences of different glass traditions, promoting the study of glass and investigating the future of blown and handmade glass in Italy and in the world.
